On motion of Bro. Gerking, the ministers are instructed to select suitable brethren in their respective fields of labor to solicit means for the support of the gospel.

On motion of Bro. David Harris, the ministers are not confined to any particular field of labor.

On motion of Bro. Harris, a committee of two was appointed in each congregation to solicit means by subscription for the support of Bro. Elliott and Bro. Hamelton.

On motion of Bro. Elliott, adjourned to half past 2 o'clock, P. M.
